CURRICULUM


The NSW Primary Syllabuses are designed to develop:

- Successful learners
- Confident and creative individuals
- Active and informed young people who are ready to take their place in society.

The six key learning areas and general capabilities are designed to prepare our students to learn, live and work in the 21^{st} century.

ENGLISH

The English curriculum for Year 1 places a strong focus on the development of literacy. Students listen to and enjoy texts that entertain, inform and persuade, such as picture books, non-fiction and film. Students grow into more independent readers, learn to create a range of different texts and become more confident when they communicate.



MATHEMATICS

Mathematics in Year 1 places a strong focus on the development of numeracy. Students are introduced to mathematical symbols and language to communicate and explain mathematical ideas; they pose basic mathematical questions and develop simple strategies to investigate and solve simple problems.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION (PDHPE)

Students start to learn more about themselves and explore their abilities. Through physical play with and without equipment, they learn skills like problem-solving and persistence, and become more confident and cooperative.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

In Year 1 students learn to investigate by observing and exploring the world around them by posing and answering questions. They learn to organise their observations, look for patterns and make predictions about their world. Through exploration, design and problem-solving, students learn how digital and other technologies work and how to create solutions with technologies.

HUMAN SOCIETY AND ITS ENVIRONMENT (HSIE) (HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY)

In Year 1 experimentation, practice and play in personal and familiar situations aim to harness students' curiosity about people, places and how things work, to make sense of their world and develop history and geography knowledge skills.

CREATIVE ARTS

Creative Arts gives students experiences in the visual arts, music, drama and dance. Through various art forms, students, independently or in groups, participate to express and reflect their growing understanding of the world. They begin to learn arts technical skills.

INCURSIONS AND EXCURSIONS

LIBRARY

Please ensure your child has a clean library bag so he or she can establish regular borrowing habits and a positive attitude to learning. Library borrowing and literature lessons will take place weekly. Children have been advised of their borrowing days. The library also opens before school every day when parents are welcome to visit with their children.

MONEY MATTERS

Money for excursions and activities needs to be sent to school in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name, class, amount and purpose of payment. Lunch orders are to be placed at the canteen between 8.45 and 9.00am. Students can make small purchases from the canteen during recess and lunch.

BIRTHDAYS

We acknowledge and value the celebration of your child's birthday at school. It would be greatly appreciated if you could:

- speak with your child's teacher prior to bringing any cakes as some of our students have allergies (no nuts or nut products).
- bring individual cupcakes or muffins at <u>12:45pm</u> so that they can be distributed by the teachers at lunch time.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Full school uniform is to be worn every day. This includes a school hat. The school follows the "No Hat, No Play" policy.
- Student belongings are to be clearly labelled.
- Please ensure your child has a healthy recess, lunch and drink each day.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is important. Students are expected to arrive at school punctually as valuable teaching and learning takes place in the first part of the school day. If students arrive late to school or are picked up before home time, a slip must be collected from the office and given to the classroom teacher.

SCRIPTURE

Scripture classes occur each Thursday for Roman Catholic, Anglican and Islamic students. Students not attending the available scripture classes will be supervised by classroom teachers.

PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

Each child in Year One will be given the opportunity to participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge. Classroom teachers will use the Premier's Reading Challenge book list as part of a class based literature program.

LITERACY

Each Year One class will work with a learning support officer in reading. This allows the classroom teacher to provide both enrichment and support for identified students. ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING
