ENGLISH

English includes reading and viewing, writing and representing and speaking and listening. Students will be provided with a varied and stimulating curriculum. Reading will take the form of shared reading, guided reading (reading groups) and there will also be opportunities for independent reading. There will be a strong emphasis on the development of writing skills, including aspects of grammar and punctuation. Talking and listening activities will be an integral part of each lesson.

CREATIVE ARTS

In addition to the classroom activities, students are given opportunities to participate in dance groups, choir, recorder group and creating and performing art groups.

 The development of sound problem solving skills will be a strong focus.



Important Requests

Parents and caregivers are asked to ensure:

- Your child attends school every day.
- Your child is at school on time.
- If arriving at school after the class roll has been marked or you are picking your child up before home time, you must first get a slip from the office.
- Your child wears full school uniform, including hat, every day.
- Your child has a healthy recess, lunch and drink each day.
- All clothes and property are clearly labelled with your child's name and class.

Each term, Year 5 will study a **History and Geography** and a **Science and Technology** unit. We are beginning the year by studying "Animal Adaptations" and "What's the Matter?".

HOME READING

Every class in Year 5 has a home reading program. Some students are required to choose a book from the appropriate level of home readers available in their classroom while others are required to choose their books from the school library. Home Reading is an integral part of each child's homework. Parents are asked to sign their child's reading log daily. All students will be participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge.

LIBRARY

Please ensure your child has a clean library bag so he or she can establish regular borrowing habits and a positive attitude to learning. Library borrowing and literature lessons will take place weekly. Children have been advised of their borrowing days. The library also opens before school every day when parents are welcome to visit with their children. In 2020, students will also participate in ICT lessons.

HOMEWORK

Generally, homework will be issued each Monday and collected on Fridays. Homework tasks are directly linked to class programs and reinforce key concepts. We encourage children to develop regular home study routines. Throughout the year, students may also be given research tasks.

Year Five is the first year that students have the opportunity to participate in an overnight camp. The children travel to Bathurst as part of the history unit on "**Gold"**. It is a muchanticipated event! There will be other excursions arranged throughout the year to enrich the students' learning experiences.
