ENGLISH

English includes reading and viewing, writing and representing and speaking and listening. Students will be provided with a varied and stimulating curriculum. Reading will take the form of shared reading, guided reading (reading groups) and there will also be opportunities for independent reading. There will be a strong emphasis on the development of writing skills, including aspects of grammar and punctuation. Talking and listening activities will be an integral part of each lesson.

CREATIVE ARTS

In addition to the classroom activities, students are given opportunities to participate in dance groups, choir, recorder group and creating and performing art groups.

Mathematics involves the four strands of:

Students will participate in individual and group activities. The development of sound problem solving skills will be a strong focus.



GOOD WORK HABITS

All students are expected to arrive at school punctually and to be fully equipped for the day. (A list of classroom stationery is included)

In addition to these stationery items, students are to be dressed in full school uniform, including suitable footwear and a school hat.

As senior members of the school, it is particularly important to be excellent role models for the younger students.

Each term, Year 5 will study a **History and Geography** and a **Science and Technology** unit. We are beginning the year by studying "*Desert Survivors*" and "*Light Shows*".

HOMEWORK

Generally, homework will be issued each Monday and collected on Fridays. Homework tasks are directly linked to class programs and reinforce key concepts. We encourage children to develop regular home study routines. Throughout the year, students may also be given research tasks.

HOME READING

Every class in Year 5 has a home reading program. Some students are required to choose a book from the appropriate level of home readers available in their classroom while others are required to choose their books from the school library. Home Reading is an integral part of each child's homework. Parents are asked to sign their child's reading log daily.

All students will be participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge.



LIBRARY

Lessons will be taught each week. During these lessons, students will be given the opportunity to borrow books of their own choosing. All students require a library bag.

EXCURSIONS and CAMPS

Year Five is the first year that students have the opportunity to participate in an overnight camp. The children travel to Bathurst as part of the history unit on "*Gold*". It is a much anticipated event! There will be other excursions arranged throughout the year to enrich the students' learning experiences.
